RULES FOR APPOINTING THE NACP AWARD BOARD

1

The Award board consists of a secretary and up to 15 experts.

2

Each National Member Organisation (NMO) nominates an expert on each of the three disciplines (Radiation Therapy, Molecular Medicine and Radiology).

One expert can cover several disciplines.

Each NMO is responsible of having appointed experts from their country at any time.

3

The Award board is formed from the experts nominated by the NMOs and acts under the NACP Council.

4

One representative to the board can be nominated by the Award holder.

This representative takes vote only on the Award he/she represents.

5

A secretary is selected from one of the NMOs. The secretarial NMO rotates in 2 year sequence starting from Sweden (then Finland, Denmark, Island and Norway).

6

The board and the secretary will not get any pay for their work, but all direct costs will be compensated by the NACP Council.

ACTION OF THE BOARD

Each time an award winner is to be chosen the secretary sends all applications, the speciality specification of the AWARD (=the award agreement) and a sheet containing the criteria for judging the applicants to all experts of the discipline in question, collects results and hands them over to the Council.

In case of a draw the secretary contacts the board members and finds up the preference.

The Council will then inform the winner and Award holder as well as take action of announcing the winner.
